A new program designed to help apprentices and young tradespeople to become successful sole contractors was launched recently in Sydney.

About the scholarship

Underpinning the HIA Build Your Future program is the HIA Training Scholarships, in partnership with JELD-WEN and supported by Stratco. The scholarships are designed to help young people achieve their training goals, reach their full potential and meet their professional development objectives. HIA training scholarships will be awarded twice a year with the first to close on 30 November. The scholarships are not restricted to HIA members or HIA apprentices, and are open to people currently employed in the residential building industry as an apprentice, employee or working as a contractor wanting to increase their skills and qualifications, typically 25 years or younger.

The HIA Build Your Future program will award full and partial training scholarships across Australia to a total value of \$200,000, with individual scholarships ranging up to \$6500, to help offset the cost of HIA training fees.

NB: The first round of scholarships close 30 November 2010; however, nominations will be received from 1 December 2010 onwards for 2011 HIA Training Scholarships. Nominees who applied for the 2010 scholarships are welcome to renominate for the 2011 scholarship program.

he HIA Build Your Future program, underpinned by an HIA Training Scholarships component, is an industry driven initiative specifically designed to support apprentices and young tradespeople in the residential building industry to go on to become successful sole contractors. It was successfully launched at the HIA-BlueScope Steel Apprentice Training Day in Sydney on 30 September (see page 90).

Partnered by JELD-WEN Australia and supported by Stratco, the HIA Build Your Future program will help apprentices to make the transition from apprenticeship to sole contractor by encouraging them to increase their qualifications and business skills and better prepare themselves for a successful future in the residential building industry. The program will also offer them the

HIA Managing Director Shane Goodwin says the HIA Build Your Future program is timely in promoting up-skilling, training and developing career pathways in the building and construction industry. It will encourage young people to do more courses, gain more licences and qualifications and, as a result, profit from the growth in the industry, he says.
